"I do not want brothers, be ignorant of them that sleep, that ye be not grieved, as the too, who have no hope. In this respect, we are taught to trust and rest in the love and wisdom of God. "Do not say in your heart, Who will ascend to the sky...? Or, Who shall descend into the deep ...?" Rom. 10:7. He, who made such a sacrifice great for the salvation of all, giving Son, certainly will not let anyone should be among the righteous outside. He does not err in judgment. Man sees the outside; God, however, sees the heart. Inside of one coffin can be one which everyone takes for granted sure as lost; but repented and received the grace of God, changing his

Breaking Free from Fear

God says that "The dead know nothing, nor do they ever have reward, but his memory was forgotten. Even their love,



their hatred and envy have perished and no longer they have no part in this century, in anything some that is done under the sun"

(Ecles. 9:5, 6). The dead ones "sleep", unconscious of what happen around them. Their body shall "return to the dust" - will be undone into the ground; and "he spirit", the breath of life, the power that keep them alive, "will retune to God, who gave it". Ecclesiastes 12:7. Then, they shall remain sleeping until the day of resurrection. The king of Israel say: "For the grave cannot praise you, death can not celebrate you: they that go down into the pit cannot hope for your truth. The living, the living, he shall praise you, as I do this day: the father to the children shall make known your truth" Isaiah 38:18, 19. Neither shall visit us to torment us or give us counsels, for "they have no part in this century, in anything

some that is done under the sun".

We need not therefore be afraid of ghosts or "souls punished." The dead they will remain sleeping the sleep of death, unconscious, until the day of resurrection. The Word of God does not teach that God he will burn the wicked for ever. It will be like this: "The hour is coming when all who are in the tombs will hear His voice (of Jesus). And the that they have done good to the resurrection of life; and those who have done evil, for resurrection of condemnation" John 5:29, 30. After being resurrected to



receive the reward for his evil deeds, the wicked they shall be burned and die for ever: "Behold, the day cometh as a fire; all the proud and all who commit wickedness shall be as straw ... And you shall tread down the wicked; for they shall be ashes under the soles of your feet in the day that I shall do this, said the LORD." Malachi 4: 1, 2. God says that the wicked "will be as if they never had been" Obadiah 1:16. The Devil himself will die. Speaking of him,

God says: "I will do perish ... you will never be forever" Eze. 28:14-19.

Many confuse some texts that relate in symbolic language the reward of the wicked, and to them they attribute a literal meaning - hence the error of understanding that the Bible upholds the belief of an "everlasting fire." An example is this: "And it shall come to pass ... All flesh shall come to worship before Me, saith the Lord. And they'll go out and see the bodies dead of men who have transgressed against Me; for his worm shall never die, neither shall his fire be quenched; and they shall be a horror to all flesh" Isa. 66:24. Worms live only a few days. or, the expression of the text "his worm will never die" can only be symbolic. It does not mean that the person will be eternally eaten by worms and burned by fire, in suffering, without ever being consumed. The text itself states that the wicked will be dead - says that the saints "will see the carcasses of the men who have transgressed." The sense of the text is that the worshipers of God will remember forever the consequences that sin brings on those who love disobedience. And so they will not want to do it again.

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
